ORDER

The undersigned Chief Judge for the South Georgia Judicial Circuit of the State of Georgia, upon her own motion, do hereby declare the existence of a judicial emergency in this circuit, pursuant to O.C.G.A. §38-3-60, et. seq. The nature of this emergency is due to Hurricane Helene which is expected to affect this judicial circuit from approximately Thursday, September 26, 2024 through Friday, September 27, 2024. The undersigned make this declaration in conformance with the Order by Governor Brian Kemp who has issued a state of emergency in the State of Georgia, including Southwest Georgia and all counties in the South Georgia Judicial Circuit, effective September 24, 2024. Accordingly, it is the order of this Court that Baker, Calhoun, Decatur, Grady, and Mitchell County Superior, Magistrate, Probate, and Juvenile Courts and Decatur, Grady, and Mitchell State Courts be closed for business Thursday, September 26, 2024 at 8:00 a.m. and continuing through and until the regular close of business on Friday, September 27, 2024. Thereafter, the above-named Courts in the South Georgia Judicial Circuit shall reopen for business on Monday, September 30, 2024, at the regular time unless further ordered by this Court.

Given the uncertain nature or duration of this emergency, this Court hereby suspends, tolls, extends and otherwise grants relief from all deadline or other time scheduled or filing requirements imposed by otherwise applicable statutes, rules, regulations, or court orders, whether in civil or criminal cases or administrative matters, including, but not limited to:

1. A statute of limitation;
2. The time within which to issue a warrant;


3. The time within which to try a case for which a demand for speedy trial has been filed;
4. The time within which to hold a commitment hearing;
5. A deadline or other schedule regarding the detention of a juvenile;
6. The time within which to return a bill of indictment or an accusation or to bring a matter before a grand jury;
7. The time within which to file a writ of habeas corpus;
8. The time within which discovery or any aspect thereof is to be completed;
9. The time within which to serve a party;
10. The time within which to appeal or to seek the right to appeal any order, ruling, or other determination;
11. The time within which hearings must be held in stalking and family violence cases and all ex-parte relief is continued until next scheduled hearing in said matter; and
12. Such other legal proceedings as may be determined to be necessary.

The relief granted herein expires at 11:59 p.m. on Friday, September 27, 2024, unless otherwise ordered by this Court.

Because this Court expects all public buildings within this circuit to be without power and closed for an indeterminate period of time, this Court is unable to designate another facility for the transaction of court business. Should the state of emergency extend beyond the closure period indicated above, this Court will make a determination of an available, appropriate facility for the conduct of court business when it is safe and appropriate to do so.

This order shall be served upon the Chief Justice of the Georgia Supreme Court, Chief Judge of the Georgia Court of Appeals and the respective clerks thereof; all judges and clerks in the South Georgia Judicial Circuit; all lawyers and litigants, if possible; and the pertinent newspapers of this Circuit. All Clerks are ordered to post this Order conspicuously in their respective courthouses and spread this Order upon the minutes of the courts.
