**ORDER EXTENDING DECLARATION OF JUDICIAL EMERGENCY DUE TO
EXPECTED HAZARDOUS WEATHER CONDITIONS ON JANUARY 23, 2025**

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61, *et seq.*, and Uniform Superior Court Rule 45, the undersigned Chief Judge of the Superior Courts for the Alcovy Judicial Circuit of Georgia does hereby extend the declaration of the existence of a Judicial Emergency in Newton County, Georgia, first declared on January 21, 2025 and extended the same date. The Court notes that the statewide State of Emergency declared by Governor Brian P. Kemp extends through next Tuesday, January 28, 2025. The nature of the Judicial Emergency continues to be a potential danger to courthouse staff and the public from accumulations of ice on roadways, bridges, and overpasses resulting from a winter weather event that began the afternoon of Tuesday, January 21, 2025, and extended into the evening. Though road conditions are improving, especially on primary roads, there remain many areas, especially on secondary roads, where ice has not melted and other areas where ice has melted but is expected to re-freeze tonight as temperatures are expected to dip to around 17 degrees (F). Such accumulations of ice have created hazardous road conditions, rendering some roads impassable and preventing courthouse staff and the public from accessing the courthouse. Furthermore, Newton County government has announced that it will remain closed due to these conditions until 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 23, 2025. These conditions will substantially endanger or infringe upon the normal functioning of the judicial system, the ability of persons to avail themselves of the judicial system, and the ability of litigants or others to have access to the courts or to meet schedules or time deadlines imposed by court order, rule, statute, or administrative rule or regulation.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61, the Newton County Courthouse shall remain **closed** until **10:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 23, 2025**, and shall re-open at that time, unless weather and road conditions remain so hazardous as to require extension of the closure. In that event, the undersigned will issue an order extending the declaration of a Judicial Emergency and extending closure of the Courthouse as allowed by O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61(b).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, during the period when the Courthouse is closed due to this Judicial Emergency, all deadlines and other time schedules and filing requirements imposed by otherwise applicable statutes, rules, regulations, or court orders, whether in civil or criminal cases or administrative matters, are hereby suspended, tolled, and extended until **Thursday**,

January 23, 2025, or until the courthouse re-opens, whichever is later. Such deadlines and time schedules include, but are not limited to:

1. statutes of limitation;
2. the time within which to issue a warrant;
3. the time within which to try a case for which a demand for speedy trial has been filed;
4. the time within which to hold a commitment hearing;
5. a deadline or other schedule regarding the detention of a juvenile;
6. the time within which to return a bill of indictment or an accusation or to bring a matter before the grand jury;
7. the time within which to file a writ of habeas corpus;
8. the time within which discovery or any aspect thereof is to be completed;
9. the time within which to serve a party;
10. the time within which to appeal or to seek the right to appeal any order, ruling, or other determination; and
11. the time within which responsive pleadings are due.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Sheriff or his designee shall post a copy of this notice on the courthouse doors.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Superior Court, or her designee, shall immediately notify the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and shall notify and serve a copy of this Order on the judges and clerks of all courts sitting within Newton County and on the clerks of the Georgia Court of Appeals and the Georgia Supreme Court by reasonable means to assure expeditious receipt.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, the County Manager, or his designee, shall post a copy of this notice and any subsequent modification or extension in accordance with O.C.G.A § 38-3-63 on the county website and all other appropriate public information systems and shall distribute a copy to local news media as well as news media in the Atlanta television and radio market.

EXPECTED HAZARDOUS WEATHER CONDITIONS ON JANUARY 22, 2025**

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61, *et seq.*, and Uniform Superior Court Rule 45, the undersigned Chief Judge of the Superior Courts for the Alcovy Judicial Circuit of Georgia does hereby extend the declaration of the existence of a Judicial Emergency in Newton County, Georgia, first declared earlier this date. The Court notes that the statewide State of Emergency declared by Governor Brian P. Kemp extends through next Tuesday, January 28, 2025. The nature of the Judicial Emergency continues to be a potential danger to courthouse staff and the public from accumulations of snow, and possibly ice, on roadways, bridges, and overpasses resulting from a winter weather event that began on Tuesday, January 21, 2025, and is continuing into the evening, even though accumulations of snow are now expected to be less than one inch. Newton County is under a winter storm warning until 7:00 a.m. Wednesday, January 22, 2025. Such accumulations are creating hazardous road conditions, possibly rendering roads impassable and preventing courthouse staff and the public from accessing the courthouse. Furthermore, Newton County’s County Manager has informed the undersigned that the county government will be closed tomorrow due to these conditions, and it is reasonable to expect that all emergency personnel, including sheriff’s deputies normally assigned to the courthouse to provide security, will be needed to attend to any emergencies caused by the weather conditions. These conditions will substantially endanger or infringe upon the normal functioning of the judicial system, the ability of persons to avail themselves of the judicial system, and the ability of litigants or others to have access to the courts or to meet schedules or time deadlines imposed by court order, rule, statute, or administrative rule or regulation.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61, the Newton County Courthouse shall be **closed on Wednesday, January 22, 2025**, and shall re-open at **8:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 23, 2025**, unless weather and road conditions remain so hazardous as to require extension of the closure. In that event, the undersigned will issue an order extending the declaration of a Judicial Emergency and extending closure of the Courthouse as allowed by O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61(b).



WEATHER CONDITIONS ON JANUARY 20, 2025**

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61, *et seq.*, and Uniform Superior Court Rule 45, the undersigned Chief Judge of the Superior Courts for the Alcovy Judicial Circuit of Georgia does hereby declare the existence of a Judicial Emergency in Newton County, Georgia. The Court notes that Governor Brian P. Kemp has also declared a statewide State of Emergency effective immediately. The nature of the Judicial Emergency is potential danger to courthouse staff and the public from an approaching winter weather event the National Weather Service (“NWS”) is forecasting to impact the State of Georgia and Newton County beginning Tuesday afternoon, January 21, 2025. Newton County is under a winter weather advisory until 7:00 a.m. Wednesday, January 22, 2025, with possible accumulations of snow and sleet up to one inch. If such accumulations occur, they will create hazardous road conditions and possibly render roads impassable, preventing courthouse staff and the public from accessing the courthouse, and endangering their safety on the drive home today. Furthermore, it is reasonable to expect that all emergency personnel, including sheriff’s deputies normally assigned to the courthouse to provide security, will be needed to attend to any emergencies caused by the weather conditions. These conditions will substantially endanger or infringe upon the normal functioning of the judicial system, the ability of persons to avail themselves of the judicial system, and the ability of litigants or others to have access to the courts or to meet schedules or time deadlines imposed by court order or rule, statute, or administrative rule or regulation.
